If you are an American citizen and would like to register to vote, GPSG has forms available at our office (825 William Pitt Union) during office hours (office hours found <u>here</u>). It takes just a few minutes to fill out and we'll even mail it for you (for free)!

If you are voting as a Pennsylvania resident, <u>there have been some changes</u> to the ID required to prove your identity when you vote. To vote in Pennsylvania, only certain forms of ID are valid. Sep. 15: SNMA Sickle Cell Shootaround


